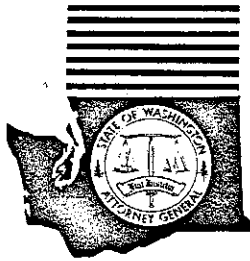

Dear Dr. Eddy:

The Pacific Northwest League for Protection of Sasquatch is moving ahead on several fronts to achieve a higher level of safety for Sasquatch. One danger, which we have not faced, is that, how we might deal with the problem of a wounded Sasquatch in need of medical attention. We are concerned that a Sasquatch might die needlessly through the fault of no one individual, simply because there was no pre-arranged plan in existence for treating such a heavy and, possibly, unwilling patient.

Thus it is that I ask if you would be willing to serve as chairman for a task force to draft a medical evacuation and treatment contingency plan which the appropriate state officials might put into action in the event a seriously wounded Sasquatch were found.

Such a contingency plan might look at some of the following areas:

Evacuation from mountainous terrain; on-site first aid; isolation of the Sasquatch from undue crowding by curious onlookers; protection from animals which might be attracted to the scene; and ultimate return to natural habitat. Your own extensive medical training would be a solid asset to any such task force. Furthermore, as we discussed in our telephone conversation, it is neither necessary or desirable that the chairman for such a task force be a specialist in the treatment of trauma, infection, or surgery, although it is easy to imagine that these particular specialties might come into play later, should the necessity for treating a Sasquatch arise.

My only suggestion would be that you cast a wide net when seeking people to help draft the contingency plan. Although I will be absent from the state for a

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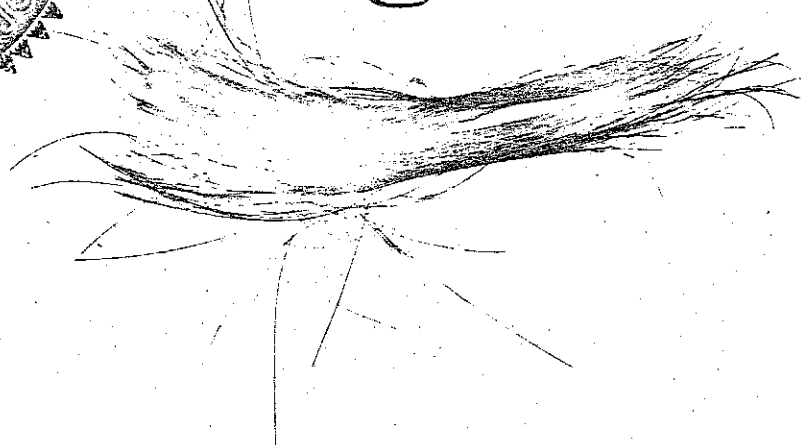
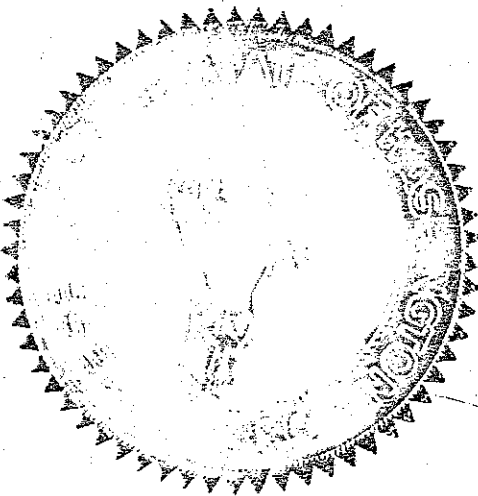

Dear Mr. Kramer:

Even though I have had no answer to my letter to you on September 30th in reference to the Sasquatch, "Big Foot", I have been very busy in this area and still seek your assistance. As I mentioned in my letter of September 30th, please refer my inquiry to the appropriate department in the State Government.

Upon returning to my winter home in Florida I found my copy of National Wildlife Federation's magazine for October-November. The lead story by their Managing Editor, Mr. George H. Harrison, is entitled, "On the Trail of the Big Foot". Mr. Harrison accompanied the American Yeti Expedition 1970 to your state, more particular to Skamania County, in June of this year. This expedition was lead by a Mr. Robert Morgan of Miami, Florida, who I have been in contact with and now have a copy of his expeditions report and findings. I also have an article from the Sunday, November 15th, Oregonian, headed, A.P. Spokane, where a Mr. Ivan Marx of Bossburg, Washington, has taken photographs of one of these creatures who appears to be wounded.

My appeal for help is the same as it was in my September 30th letter. Any information that any department of the State of Washington can give me on these people and this subject, would be greatly appreciated.

Mr. Morgan mentions in his report his contact with the County Sheriff, Bill Closner, as well as Commissioner Conrad Lundy. He further states that the County has passed an ordinance prohibiting the harming of one of these creatures and, in fact, levying a \$10,000.00 fine as punishment. He further mentions a Mr. Roy Craft, Editor of the Skamania County Pioneer Newspaper.

An Act Relating to the Protection of Sasqatch;

DRAFT

Creating New Sections;

And Declaring An Emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON

NEW SECTION

SEC.1. The Legislature of the State of Washington declares the policy of this State to be the protection of the species known as Sasquatch from physical harm, aggravation, and harassment.

NEW SECTION

SEC.2. There is added to Chapter 77.12 RCW a new section to read as follows:

The Commission is authorized to adopt such reasonable rules and regulations as will promote the policy as set forth in Section 1 of this Act.

NEW SECTION

SEC.3. Hunting or trapping of Sasquatch is/are hereby declared to be a felony.

NEW SECTION

SEC.§. This Act is hereby declared to be necessary to preserve the health, safety and welfare of the State of Washington, and shall take effect immediately.

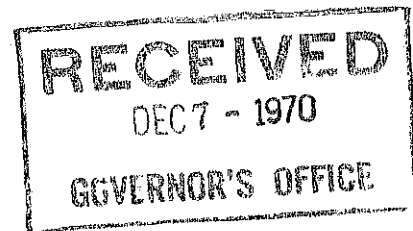
